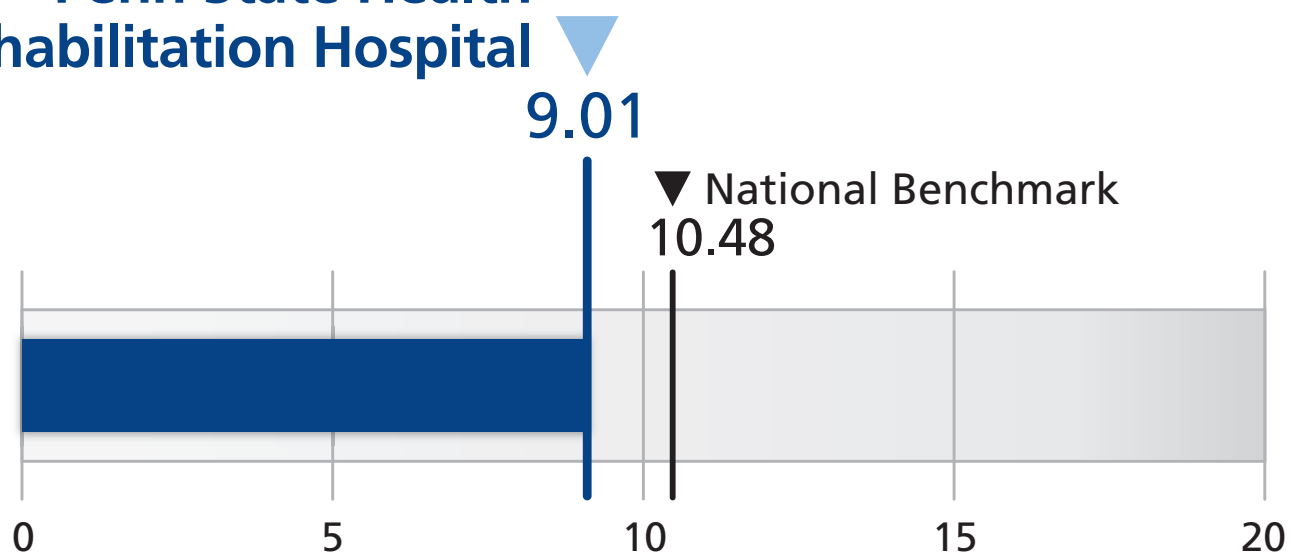

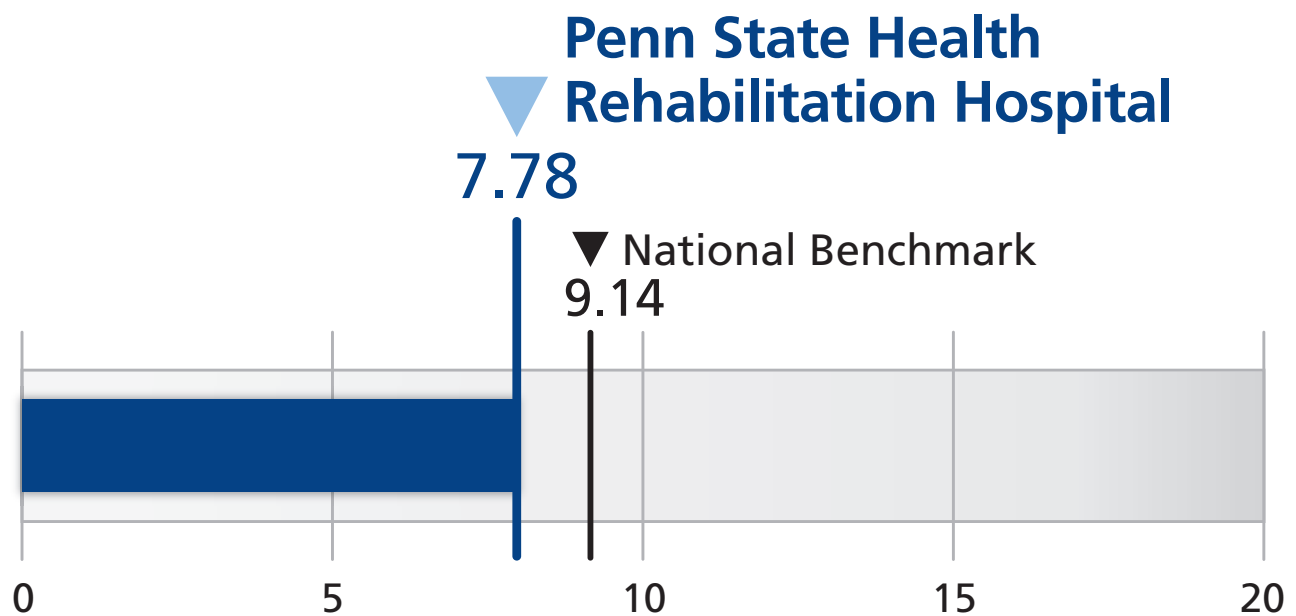


Functional improvement in mobility measures a patient's level of independence in bed (rolling from side to side), transfers (moving from bed to chair) and walking with/without assistive devices (cane, walker, wheelchair).

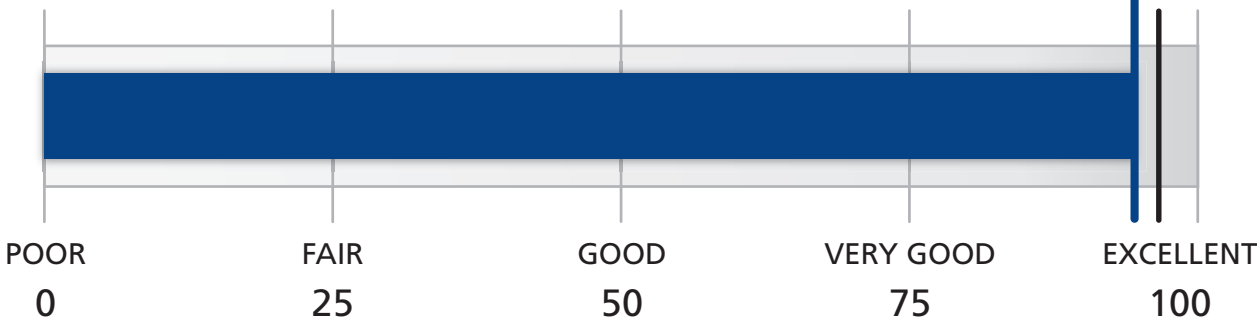
Functional improvement measures a patient's functional progress from admission to discharge. Self-care function denotes a patient's level of independence with daily living activities such as bathing, dressing and eating.

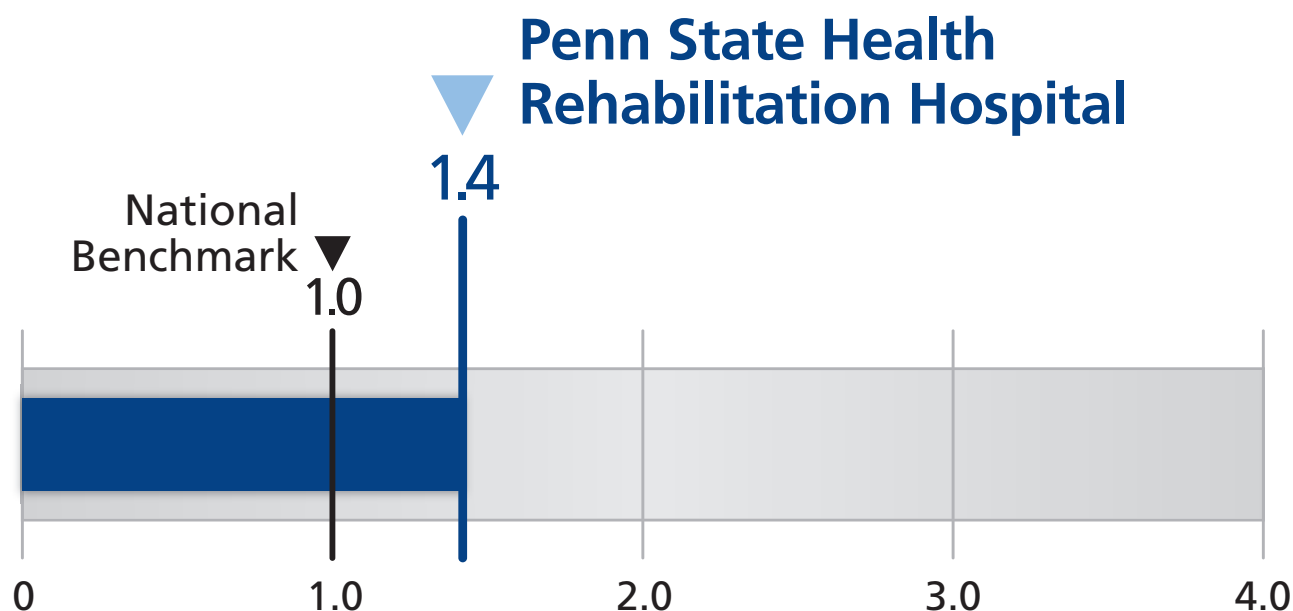

Patient Satisfaction is based on the reported overall satisfaction of our patients during their stay. Ratings are converted to a 100-point scale based on patient responses.

CATHETER-ASSOCIATED URINARY TRACT INFECTION RATE

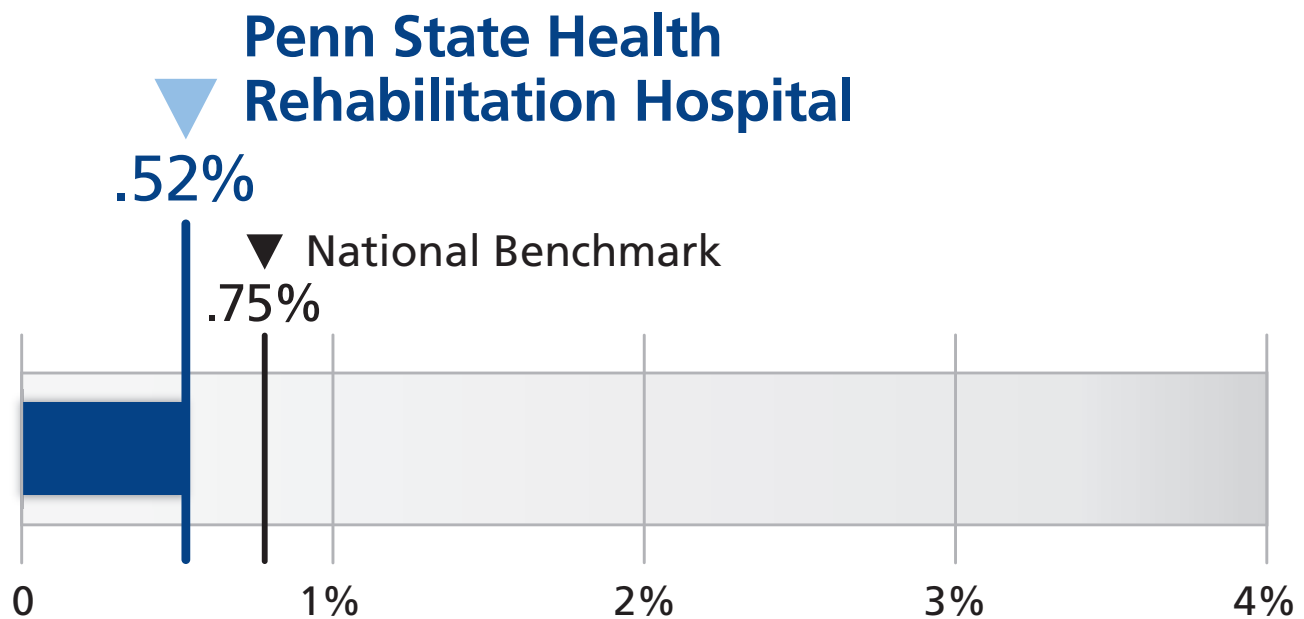

When patients use urinary catheters, it is possible to acquire an infection. This outcome is measured using a Standardized Infection Ratio (SIR). An SIR of 1 or less means the hospital performs the same or better than the nation.

PRESSURE INJURY ACQUIRED/WORSENERD

Rate of pressure injuries that are new or worsened.
Low percentages are better.

Pressure injuries are localized injuries to the skin and/or underlying tissue that may occur over a bony part of the body as a result of pressure. The rate is based on the percentage of new or worsened pressure injuries occurring during a patient's hospital stay.

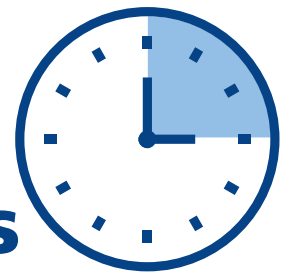

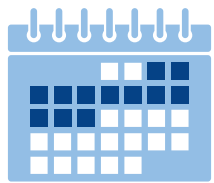
